Professor Wu traced the history of racial profiling and its harm to the U.S., including the current criminalization of researchers, as well as shifting and double standards.

Professor Zweig provided the historical background of China's talent programs and statistical analysis of its results. In addition, he recommended specific actions to both the U.S. and Chinese governments. Some of his ideas parallel Professor Margaret Lewis's five recommended actions presented in the July 6 APA Justice meeting.
