## Racial Profiling at the U.S. Department of Commerce

APA Justice is tracking the developments of the reported abuse of non-existent authority and targeting of Asian American employees by The Investigations and Threat Management Service (ITMS) at the Department of Commerce (DOC) on the front page of its website at <a href="https://www.apajustice.org/">https://www.apajustice.org/</a>.

Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo has pledged to conduct a thorough review and implement a comprehensive solution to the issues raised. She was sworn in as the 40th U.S. Secretary of Commerce on March 3, 2021.

Concurrently, more than a dozen whistleblowers have given closed-door statements to the minority-party staff of the Senate Commerce Committee under Sen. Roger Wicker (R-MS), among them former investigators who allege that the office routinely overstepped its legal limits and has operated without meaningful oversight from within DOC since the mid-2000s. An official report will be released in the coming months.

There are at least two DOC Asian American employees who were interrogated by ITMS agents and led to their wrongful prosecutions - Sherry Chen and Dr. Chunzai Wang. Available facts and evidence strongly indicate that the misconduct at DOC is not limited to only ITMS.
